Nations, global or regional groupings, community actors such as faith-based leadership, civil society institutions, and the commercial sector must see reparations for child victims or vulnerable individuals via a child-centered, trauma-aware, or gender-sensitive perspective to achieve this objective. Public health legislation or efforts, such as schools, should do more to raise awareness of sexual assault, smuggling, commercialization, and child abuse.

It is necessary to offer a child-friendly legislative framework, transparency procedures, and notably competent legal and judicial education. Due to the global nature of child sexual exploitation and abuse, States Parties must stress collaboration at both the local and international levels to fight these crimes and aid their victims or sufferers.
